WHAT IS WAND?

A national women's peace and security organization that empowers women to affect legislation.

Founded in 1982 as Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament, WAND focused on bringing women into the discussion about nuclear weapons. When the cold war ended we changed our name and broadened our mission. Now known as Women's Action for New Directions, WAND is a recognized United Nations NGO focusing on nuclear weapons, the military budget, and war. WAND affects public policy at the federal congressional level. Since 1991, WAND has focused on real security by seeking to reduce nuclear weapons, redirect excessive military spending to unmet human and environmental needs, and end our reliance on war over peacemaking. WAND trains, educates and assists activists, women legislators and a wide range of organizations to influence Congress.

WAND WOMEN ARE community organizers, activists, educators, legislators, business leaders, students, grandmothers, mothers, daughters and sisters.

WHAT DOES WAND DO?

WAND empowers women to act politically to reduce violence and militarism, and redirect excessive military resources toward unmet human and environmental needs.

HOW DOES WAND DO IT?

Lobbying and Legislation

- › WAND sends detailed and timely action alerts to mobilize members, activists and state legislators.
- › WAND lobbyists on Capitol Hill keep WAND members current, relevant and informed.

Training

- › WAND offers in-person and online training sessions on media, messaging, lobbying, and leadership.
- › WAND hosts a biennial conference in Washington, DC featuring prominent officials, renowned professionals and communications experts.
- › WAND presents frequent webinars and conference calls to connect you with the leading authorities on WAND issues in the convenience of your home or office.

WAND PAC

- › WAND PAC supports women who are running for U.S. Congress who share our priorities. Forty-three women in the 112th Congress come from WAND and WiLL.

Connecting State Legislators to Capitol Hill

- › WiLL, the Women Legislators Lobby, a program of WAND, is a national non-partisan network of women state legislators who work together to influence federal policy and budget priorities. WiLL has members in all 50 states.
